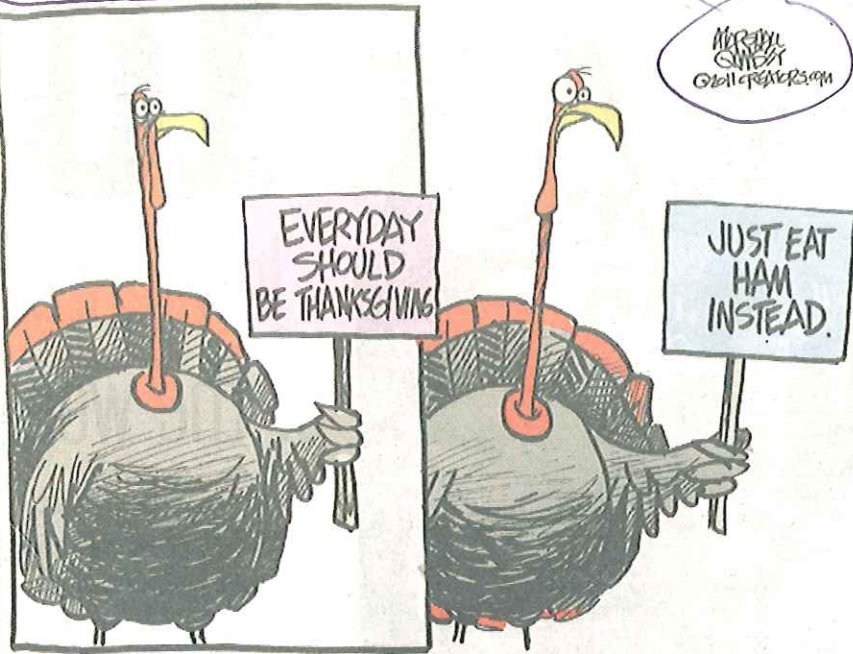


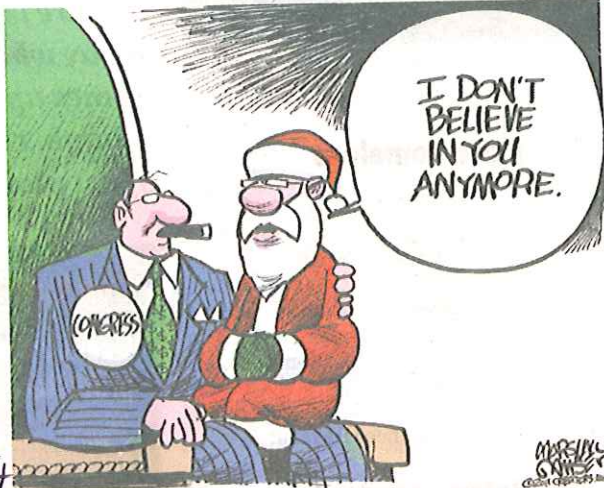

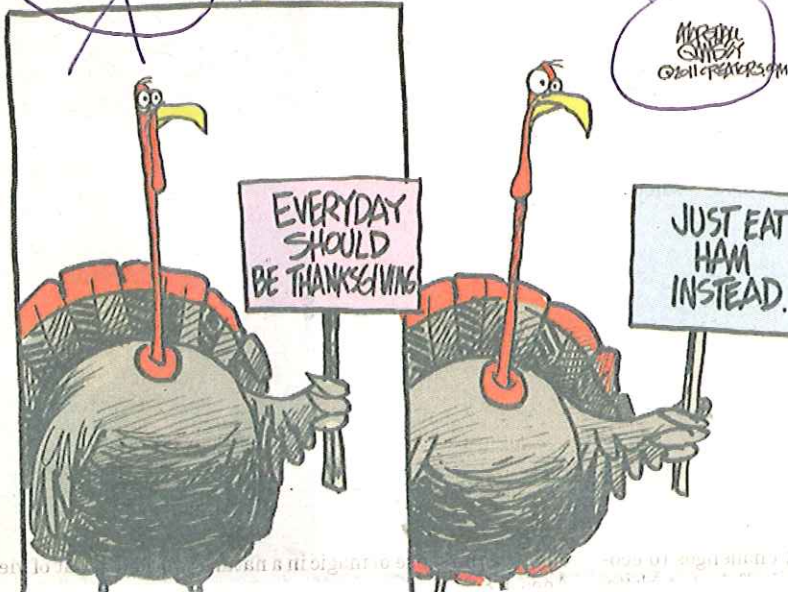

Supplements containing St. John's wort may interfere with birth control, antidepressants, blood thinners and other drugs, a consumer group says.
